

## Cotati Police Working For You



Maybe you've had a chance to chat with your police at National Night Out or at Coffee with a Cop or maybe even reading to children at Thomas Page Academy. Or maybe you've seen them keeping our streets safer by pulling over speeders around town. You may not know that they are also busy solving crimes, including arresting the person who was responsible for the miniature horse hit and run in Penngrove and some great undercover work to arrest the person responsible for a series of burglaries around Sonoma County. Next time you see a Coffee with a Cop event, or just see them on the street, introduce yourself and say hi!

## The City is Busy Saving Electricity

The City undertook a series of energy efficiency improvements; primarily lighting retrofits in the City buildings and the decorative street lights that the City owns (PG&E owns most of the other street lights). The City started by switching from PG&E to Sonoma Clean Power, which reduced the electricity bill. On top of that, the energy retrofits were expected to save the City another \$18,000 per year. There was a verification of the savings this year, which found that that actual savings were \$19,000 after one year. As expected, the savings on the electricity bill paid for the retrofits and will allow the City to put these savings back into project and services to benefit you.

### Downtown Specific Plan Area Revitalization

As mentioned in the last newsletter, final work on this project has been delayed by the exceptionally wet winter. However, we are expecting that work will resume shortly as the weather improves. The remaining work includes a final stucco finish on the plaza walls, integral benches in the plazas, final repairs to the roadway, final striping at crosswalks and bike lanes, and street furniture (garbage cans, bike racks, and benches).
